Each month and quarter, our Medical Coverage Guidelines (MCGs) for the Commercially insured are updated and published at FloridaBlue.com under Medical and Pharmacy Policies and Guidelines, What's New. The July 15, 2023, updates include, but are not limited to, the Hydroxyprogesterone Caproate MCG which removes MCG withdrawal of the medication approval. This update also shows the Brand Gilenya and Tascenso ODT MCG which now includes dosing for members 40 kg or less and an update for the use of Tascenso ODT for members who are 17 years of age or younger. Dual Eligible Special Needs Plan Model of Care: Required Training for Medicare Advantage HMO Provider Groups Due September

Health care providers and staff who deliver care to Dual Eligible Special Needs Plan (D-SNP) members and are contracted by managed care organizations, such as Florida Blue Medicare, are required by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services to receive basic training on the D-SNP Model of Care. To ensure compliance, your provider group must complete this course and submit the required attestation **by September 30, 2023.** Learn more>>
