The Food and Drug Administration is no longer authorizing Bebtelovimab as a treatment for COVID-19. The treatment is no longer expected to neutralize Omicron sub-variants BQ.1 and BQ.1.1. This change has been in effect since November 30, 2022. <u>Learn more>></u>

Call for Acupuncturists to Join New Provider Network for Commercial Lines of Business

We are currently contracting for an acupuncture (ACU) provider network. Providers with a primary license of acupuncture will be eligible. Specialists who have acupuncture as a sub-specialty (i.e., chiro with ACU as secondary) are not eligible to contract for this network. <u>Learn more>></u>

Number of Referral Visits Increase for BlueMedicare HMO

The number of specialist referrals allowed for BlueMedicare HMO Medicare Advantage members has increased to six. Latest Updates to our Commercially Insured Pharmacy Medical Coverage Guidelines

Each month and quarter, our Medical Coverage Guidelines (MCGs) for the Commercially insured are updated and published at FloridaBlue.com under Medical and Pharmacy Policies and Guidelines, What's New. The February 15 updates include, but are not limited to, the Tymlos MCG which now includes an indication to increase bone density in men with osteoporosis at high risk for fracture. This update also shows the Tzield MCG which is indicated to delay the onset of stage 3 Type 1 diabetes. The upcoming April 1 update will show a change to the GCSF) MCG to include the following preferred long-acting GCSFs: Fulphila, Neulasta, Nyvepria, Udenyca, and Ziextenzo.
