

You may qualify for a lower monthly premium, deductible and copays for your prescriptions.

If you meet certain income requirements, you may be eligible for **Extra Help**. This government program is designed to help people pay for their Medicare Part D prescription costs, such as premiums, annual deductible and coinsurance. **If you receive Medicaid, help from a Medicare Savings Program, or Supplemental Security Income (SSI), you'll be automatically enrolled in Extra Help**.

How Extra Help Works

- Work with Florida Blue Medicare to help answer your questions, determine your eligibility and get the process started if you qualify.
- From there, we'll contact the Social Security Administration (SSA), who will then contact Medicare, which will notify you of any awarded level of assistance ranging from 25% 100%.

Medicare or Social Security will periodically review your eligibility to make sure that you still qualify for Extra Help with your Medicare prescription drug plan costs. Your eligibility for Extra Help might change if there is a change in your income or assets, if you get married or become single or if you lose Medicaid.

If you're awarded financial help from Medicare, you may receive a reduction in your Medicare Advantage or Part D premium*. If you receive Extra Help from Medicare to pay for your prescriptions, your copays will also be reduced, based on the level of financial help you receive.
