Federal Employee Program Hemoglobin A1c Control for Patients with Diabetes (HBD)

Florida Blue patients (18 to 75 years old) insured under the Blue Cross and Blue Shield Federal Employee Program[®] (FEP) who are currently non-compliant with the Hemoglobin A1c Control for Patients with Diabetes HEDIS measure, will be receiving an email this month encouraging them to begin and/or continue A1c testing. This communication emphasizes the importance of testing and provides options for where members can complete testing.

How You Can Help

- Frequency of visits should depend on level of A1c control; members with elevated A1c levels need to be seen more frequently.
- Follow up with diabetic patients to monitor changes and schedule additional testing.
- For point-of-care HbA1c testing, document the date of the in-office test with the result; the office must submit the CPT code for the test performed in addition to CPT-II codes to report A1c result value.

The following table outlines some of the CPT II Codes to use for hemoglobin A1c results.

hemoglobin A1c level greater than 9.0% (DM) - **3046F** hemoglobin A1c (HbA1c) level greater than or equal to 7.0% and less than 8.0% (DM) - **3051F** hemoglobin A1c (HbA1c) level less than 7.0% (DM) - **3044F** hemoglobin A1c (HbA1c) level greater than or equal to 8.0% and less than or equal to 9.0% (DM) - **3052F**
