

Part B Step Therapy Updates for Medicare Advantage

Florida Blue is making a change in Part B step therapy programs. Effective May 15, 2023, BlueMedicareSM is including additional drugs to the programs affecting patients enrolled in Medicare Advantage.

Drug Alternatives

Step therapy is required, and the definition of medical necessity must be met, for certain higher-cost non-preferred medications. We encourage you to consider prescribing one of the following preferred alternatives (pre-authorization may apply) instead of the non-preferred drugs:
