Where should I go when I need care?



Remember, where you go matters!

When you need care, choosing the right place for treatment can help you avoid higher costs and hours of waiting. Start with your primary care doctor. They can treat common conditions like cold, flu, sore throat and minor injuries. They can also be seen for routine exams, vaccinations and screenings.

When you can't see your primary care doctor, follow this guide:



(4) Virtual Visits

Virtual visits are an easy way to get care anytime and anywhere! As a Truli for Health member, virtual visits with designated primary care doctors, mental health providers and other specialists are covered by your Truli for Health Plan. Use virtual visits for conditions like:

- Minor conditions (cough, low back pain, sore throat, etc.)
- Mental health & substance use counseling
- Dermatology concerns (rashes, etc.)

If a health system doesn't offer **virtual visits**, you can use Teladoc. Download the Teladoc app from your app store or visit **teladoc.com**.



Urgent Care Centers (UCC)

Urgent care centers are less expensive than emergency rooms (ERs) and often have shorter wait times. Visit an urgent care center for conditions like:

- Cold, flu, cough and fever
- Strains, sprains and breaks
- Infections
- Mild burns

Emergency Room

Going to an ER for an issue that isn't life threatening can mean long wait times and high medical bills. Examples of symptoms that are serious and require an ER include:

- Severe chest pain (a possible heart attack)
- Drooping face, arm weakness and slurred speech (a possible stroke)
- Severe or sudden shortness of breath
- Sudden or unexplained loss of consciousness

If you have a life-threatening emergency, call 911 right away.

Your doctor must be considered a designated provider for your virtual visit to be covered by Truli. That way, you can avoid paying full out-of-pocket costs for your visit.

Follow these 3 easy steps to see if your assigned primary care doctor is designated or find a new designated provider that offers virtual visits.

Go to **truliforhealth.com** or download our Truli for Health app. From there, you can log in to your member account.



Select the **Find Care** tab and search by your location, doctor or specific condition. **Designated providers will have the virtual visit phone icon by their name.**

Schedule your next virtual visit with a designated provider.

You could save on medical costs by choosing to go to an urgent care center (UCC).

Example:

Going to a UCC for treatment of a sprained ankle (Total allowed charges: \$158)

- You pay \$55*
- Truli for Health covers \$103*

Going to an ER for treatment of a sprained ankle (Total allowed charges: \$1,719)

- You pay \$626*
- Truli for Health covers \$1,093*

Note: ER cost includes facility fees.

Example:

Going to a **UCC** for treatment of flu symptoms (Total allowed charges: \$158)

- You pay \$59*
- Truli for Health covers \$99*

Going to an **ER** for treatment of flu symptoms (Total allowed charges: \$2,132)

- You pay \$765*
- Truli for Health covers \$1,367*
