

## **HEDIS Minimum Documentation Guide for Measurement Year 2023**

Key indicators for select Healthcare Effectiveness Data and Information Set (HEDIS®1) measures are outlined below. These are measures that require additional information from the medical chart to complement claims data for a full picture of the care or services provided. Compliance can be reported via claims (administrative specification) and through medical record documentation (hybrid specification). This guide is focused on documentation that meets the hybrid specifications for these HEDIS measures.

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The medical record, lab reports, progress notes and documents must have the following information:

- Member's name and date of birth on each page
- Physician's name and signature

Blood Pressure Control for Patients with Diabetes (BPD)	<ol> <li>2023 office visit, telehealth visit, encounter or vital sign flowsheet documenting the most recent BP reading during the measurement year</li> <li>Documentation of treatment in 2022 or 2023 for any of the following:</li> <li>Polycystic ovarian syndrome</li> <li>Gestational diabetes</li> <li>Drug or chemical induced diabetes</li> <li>Hospice or palliative care during the measurement year</li> </ol>	

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Eye Exam for Patients with Diabetes (EED)	<ol> <li>Diabetic eye exam in 2022 or 2023:</li> <li>Copy of the dilated eye exam read by an eyecare professional or artificial intelligence</li> <li>Progress note indicating the date it was completed, with the results and the name of eye care professional</li> <li>Consultation note/letter from eye care professional indicating that an ophthalmic exam was completed, including date and results of the exam</li> <li>Documentation indicating bilateral eye enucleation anytime during the member's life or acquired absence of both eyes</li> <li>Documentation of treatment in 2022 or 2023 for any of the following:         <ul> <li>Polycystic ovarian syndrome</li> <li>Gestational diabetes</li> <li>Drug or chemical induced diabetes</li> <li>Hospice or palliative care during the measurement year</li> </ul> </li> </ol>
Colorectal Cancer Screening (COL)	1. Documentation of colorectal cancer or a total colectomy 2. Documentation of <b>one</b> of the following screenings and the date it was performed:  • Colonoscopy between 2014 and 2023  • Fit-DNA (Cologuard®) between 2021 and 2023  • Fecal occult blood test (FOBT) in 2023  • Flexible sigmoidoscopy between 2019 and 2023  • Computerized tomography (CT) colonography between 2019 and 2023  3. Childhood Immunization Status (CIS)	<ol> <li>Documentation of all immunizations administered by the second birthday:         <ul> <li>DTAP: 4 doses</li> <li>HIB: 3 doses</li> <li>HEP A: 1 dose</li> </ul> </li> <li>IPV: 3 doses</li> <li>HEP B: 3 doses</li> <li>Pneumococcal: 4 doses</li> <li>MMR: 1 dose</li> <li>Varicella: 1 dose</li> <li>Rotarix: 2 doses or RotaTeq: 3 doses (rotavirus vaccine)</li> <li>Influenza: 2 doses with two different dates of service; LAIV administered on the second birthday meets criteria</li> <li>Immunization record</li> <li>Immunization registry (Florida SHOTS)</li> <li>History of encephalopathy on or before the second birthday</li> <li>History of Immunodeficiency on or before the second birthday</li> <li>History of the illness or Seropositive test for MMR, Hep B, Hep A, VZV on or before the second birthday</li> <li>History of anaphylactic reaction on or before the second birthday</li> <li>Hospice care during the measurement year</li> </ol>
Cervical Cancer Screening (CCS)	<ol> <li>Pap smear with results and findings between 2021 and 2023</li> <li>Pap smear with HPV co-testing performed between 2019 and 2023</li> <li>Evidence of cervical high-risk HPV between 2019 and 2023</li> <li>History of total hysterectomy (no cervix) or vaginal hysterectomy</li> <li>Hospice or palliative care during the measurement year</li> </ol>
Immunizations for Adolescents (IMA)	<ol> <li>Documentation of the following immunizations by the 13<sup>th</sup> birthday:         <ul> <li>1 dose of Tdap</li> <li>2 doses (at least 146 days apart) or 3 doses (with different dates of service) of HPV</li> <li>1 dose of meningococcal</li> </ul> </li> <li>Immunization record (flow sheet)</li> </ol>

Postpartum Care (PPC)	<ul> <li>Documentation of first day of last menstrual period (LMP) or estimated due date (EDD) in conjunction with either a prenatal risk assessment and counseling and education or complete OB history</li> </ul>

Transition of Care (TRC)	Documentation of each of the following:
	Receipt of notification of the inpatient admission on the day of admission     through two days after the admission with a date and time stamp.
	through two days after the admission with a date and time stamp  o Communication between inpatient providers or the emergency room department
	and the primary care providers (faxes, emails, phone calls)
	Receipt of the discharge information on the day of discharge through two
	days after the discharge
	o Discharge summary/summary of care record
	Patient engagement within 30 days of discharge
	Clear documentation of member being seen for a post hospital follow up
	Documentation of medication reconciliation completed post-discharge including the date it was performed
	○ Documentation can be from an outpatient, office, home or telehealth/virtual visit
	record and must include the date it was performed
	○ Documentation that no meds were prescribed at time of discharge
	Hospice care during the measurement year



## 1. Weight assessment (documented in 2023)

- Documentation of BMI percentile as a value or BMI percentile plotted on agegrowth chart(must include height, weight and BMI percentile)
- Office visit, telephone visit, e-visits or virtual check-in, or encounter documentation anytime in the measurement year
- 2. Nutrition counseling (documented in 2023)
  - Office visit, telephone visit, e-visits or virtual check-in, or encounter documentation anytime in the measurement year
  - Discussion of current nutrition behaviors (e.g., eating habits, dieting behaviors)
  - Checklist indicating nutrition was addressed
  - Counseling or referral for nutrition education
  - Received educational materials about nutrition during a face-to-face visit
  - Anticipatory guidance for nutrition
  - Weight or obesity counseling
  - Referral to Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants and Children (WIC)
- 3. Counseling for physical activity (documented in 2023)
  - Office visit, telephone visit, e-visits or virtual check-in, or encounter documentation anytime in the measurement year
  - Discussion of current physical activity behaviors (e.g., exercise routine, participation in sports activities, exam for sports participation)
  - Checklist indicating physical activity was addressed
  - Counseling or referral for physical activity
  - Received educational materials on physical activity during a face-to-face visit
  - Anticipatory guidance specific to the child's physical activity
  - Weight or obesity counseling

- 5. Diagnosis of Pregnancy during the measurement year
