Financial help for health insurance is available for many immigrants.

### **Get Covered Florida**

Signing up for a health insurance plan is an important step in keeping you and your family healthy.

Regardless of your immigration status, a licensed insurance agent can help determine if you qualify for financial assistance from the government for a health insurance plan (also known as a subsidy).

This will NOT negatively impact your immigration status and process due to the public charge regulations, which were eliminated in March 2021.



### You may qualify for lower cost health insurance if you:

- Are a U.S. Citizen
- Are a U.S. Lawful Permanent Resident (Green Card holder)
- Are asylum seekers (if you've been granted employment authorization or are under the age of 14 and have had an application pending for at least 180 days)
- Are a Cuban or Haitian entrant
- Have a Temporary Protected Status (TPS)
- Mave a work or student visa
- And many other statuses qualify
